MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
(CIDC AND DR.BRAOU)

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Construction Industry Development Council (CIDC), New Delhi, hereinafter called as FIRST PARTY and Dr.B.R.Ambedkar Open University (Dr.BRAOU), Hyderabad, hereinafter called as SECOND PARTY for training and education of construction industry workers and, for that purpose, to launch a Pilot Project to establish CIDC Training Centres in Andhra Pradesh.

The first party which is the apex body representing Indian Construction Industry has, among its charter of activities, human resource development in construction industry as one of the prime objectives, and the second party which is a State Open University with Andhra Pradesh as its jurisdiction, established under an Act of Legislature has, among its major objectives, the education and training of the human resources of the State for the development of its economy, especially, through an innovative system of education at University level.

Both first and second parties have decided to enter into this MoU to initiate, develop and implement programmes of education and training in Construction Trades to meet the developmental needs of the construction industry.

This MoU sets out the following plan of action for implementation:

- Both parties agree that programmes will be spearheaded by a Pilot Project to initiate specific action in this direction and to obtain feedback for guiding the development of future programmes.
- Both parties agree to expand, enlarge and diversify the Pilot Project in order to meet the long-term training and education needs of construction workers.
- Both parties agree to review jointly, at the end, or at some stage of the Pilot Project, the feasibility or otherwise of establishing a system to meet the long-term requirement of the Project.

The specific responsibilities of both the parties in the implementation of the Pilot Project shall be as follows:

(A) FIRST PARTY :

- The first party shall establish, through constituents or Industry, CIDC Trade Training Centres in Andhra Pradesh. These Constituent Centres, identified by CIDC, shall be known as "CIDC Trade Training Centres" and shall be imparting training in various Construction Trades

- Initially, under the Pilot Project, following Trades shall be taken up for training:
 1. Mason
 2. Bar-Bender/Steel Fixer
 3. Shuttering Carpenter
 4. Electrical Wireman
 5. General Works Supervisor
- Provision of land and space, working staff, tools and equipment and other logistical requirements shall be provided by the Constituent Centres, Dr.BRAOU would not be responsible for any financial commitment in the implementation of this programme.
- CIDC Trade Training Centres shall conduct the Trade Courses based on the syllabus designed by the second party, conduct examinations and award certificates adhering to the standards laid down by the second party.

B. SECOND PARTY:

The Second Party shall draw up:

- Vocational qualification programmes for skill standardization and certification, based on competence acquired through experience and training given to workers in construction industry. Such syllabus for these programmes shall be drawn based on the needs of the Industry. The second party shall also be responsible for testing and certification of skill through respective CIDC Constituent Centres and shall draw up necessary systems for implementation, in consultation with the first party.
- The decision of the programmes would be based on the recommendations made by the second party with broad based participation of various constituents of the Construction Industry as well as academic institutions.
- The Second Party shall develop appropriate training and learning materials for learning at work sites and shall evolve methodologies and approaches for competency based certification in various trades and techniques.
- A Technical-cum-Programme Co-ordination Committee will be constituted to oversee development and implementation of these programmes. The Chairman of the Committee will be Vice-Chancellor and the Committee will consist of the following members:

- I. Three nominees of CIDC
- II. Three nominees of Dr.BRAOU

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
